

President's Message by Tom Adams:

Watching former President Trump addressing a very supportive crowd at the CPAC Annual Conference in Orlando I was struck by what might have been in a second Trump term. We would have finished the wall, securing our southern border, tightening sanctions to keep Iran nuclear free, seeing our partners in NATO paying their fair share for our mutual defense; all building on the successes of his first term.

Instead, what do we have? Well, it is certainly true the guy we elected has no desire for a bipartisan approach to our current challenges. Or as President Trump said at CPAC "We knew it was going to be bad, but we didn't know how far left they would go." Now we know. Amendment 3 reduces the length of time proposed bylaws amendments must lay on the table before they can be voted on by the membership from 30 to 21 days. The 30 day requirement is in reality a 60 day requirement given publishing deadlines. That is too long. The reduction will allow us to be more nimble in addressing changing needs in the future.

The Executive Committee recommends you vote in favor of all three amendments. If you have questions about any of these please see me or ask any member of the Executive Committee. My thanks to our club Secretary Bill Scholtes for preparing the amendments. Have a great month and I'll see you at the luncheon.

February Meeting Report:

February 18th was the second MCRMC meeting in the new year. As with virtually all of the previous meetings for the last many years, there was an Executive Committee (EC) meeting held at 9:30am prior to the luncheon meeting. EC meetings are where the club business is conducted with discussions, motions where needed and votes on actions, policies, etc. are held. Minutes of these EC meetings are prepared and approved so they can be kept as a record of the EC's actions. As attendees arrive for registration before lunch, they may see the EC members in the room adjacent to the main dining room finishing up their monthly meeting.

As attendees began to arrive they found name badges to the left just inside the dining room door. As at all luncheon meetings, the attendees got their name badges and then went to the registration table to pay



for lunch before greeting fellow attendees and finding a luncheon table. Speakers, members of the EC who will be speaking, special

guests and a few other officers were seated at the two front reserved tables. All other attendees found tables with friends and other attendees.

At noon, President Tom Adams stepped up to the lectern and called the meeting to order. Adams asked Club Chaplain, Rev. Mike Dubbs, to come forward and offer an opening prayer and bless the food that would be served at lunch. US Congressman for NC District 9, Dan Bishop was in attendance and Adams asked him to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Adams then asked Congressman Bishop to come forward for remarks. Following Bishop's



comments, Adams made some opening remarks and introduced dignitaries and guests. Adams then asked Moore County Sheriff Ronnie Fields to step

forward for an announcement. Fields announced that he would be running for another term as Sheriff and ask for the support of the attendees.

Following the opening announcements and remarks,

lunch was served by the CCNC staff. This was the first luncheon since the Covid restrictions that lunch was served all at one time. Previously the Covid protocol required folks to be served as soon as they were seated. It was a welcome change and relief to get back to lunch being served to all at the same time.

As attendees were finishing lunch and enjoying dessert and coffee, VP Programs Patrick Haggerty took the lectern to introduce the program speaker, Amy Cooke, CEO of the John Locke Foundation.



Cooke is also the publisher of Carolina Journal. In her opening remarks, Cooke announced that with her middle name starting with an "O" she was the "other" (conservative) AOC! Cooke enlightened the audience with current information on the state of politics in NC and where the conservative voters needed to go in order to hold off the wave of liberal social democrat initiatives coming our way. Channeling C.S. Lewis

Following Nazi Germany's relentless bombing campaign in 1940 and 1941, Londoners would face many more years of hardship until World War II ended in 1945. There was fear of occupation. There was rationing. And, everywhere, there was destruction.

Through it all, Brits had come to depend on the reassuring counsel of C.S. Lewis, arguably among the most famous writers of the era, first as a novelist and by the 1940s owed to his writings on Christianity. The Irish-born, former atheist was an accidental celebrity to say the least. The Village Chapel's Pastor John Jacobs, a Lewis expert, says he seemed to appeal to readers across the spectrum of religious allegiances because he wrote about his newfound faith as a lay person, not as a theologian.

In 1941 the British Broadcasting Corporation, through its director of religious broadcasting, asked Lewis if he would agree to deliver brief radio commentaries to its listening audience. He accepted. In the years to follow, the 15 minutes Londoners spent with Lewis on Sunday nights were viewed as sacred; an appointment not to be missed.

The gift Lewis gave to his war-weary citizens was quite the opposite of the inspiring, rhetorical flourishes delivered by Winston Churchill. Lewis made common sense out of Christianity and made it relevant to the vulnerable.

"What's the sense of saying the enemy is in the wrong," Lewis said, "unless right is a real thing?"

Here in 2021, do we not repeatedly ask this question, knowing that it is the central question? But I would ask another question first. Do we have a yet undiscovered C.S. Lewis in our midst in the 21st Century in America?

We have Anthony Fauci, a Swamp creature annoyed by all of us because we want to live as free citizens. We have Rush Limbaugh. We as conservatives are blessed to have Rush as our ideological voice but the other side was thrilled by Limbaugh's lung cancer diagnosis a year ago. We have Franklin Graham, who honors his father's legacy by delivering God's love tangibly to the world's suffering. We have Tucker Carlson, to whom we owe our gratitude for crushing hypocrites and exposing deception at every turn.

But what America desperately needs today is a C.S. Lewis, a scholar who dreaded the scholarly, an author who wrote not for peers but for real people, and who stepped forward as a servant of God at a moment in history when no else could have served as well. Imagine, today, fringe talk show host Bill Maher, a witty, far Left atheist, converting to Christianity. That would be a wakeup call.

First, it must be said that Great Britain, in 1941, identified entirely as a Christian nation. In 2021, the U.S. is a Judeo-Christian nation teetering on the brink of becoming a Socialist nation in which religion has long been marginalized and is increasingly persecuted, even despised.

If we have in our midst a C.S. Lewis he will not be invited by the establishment media to come forward to console us. He will emerge at a considerable risk to his livelihood, his security and his reputation.

Perhaps we delude ourselves thinking there is one such person in this social media age. Perhaps the answer to our dilemma is not found in a person but in a chorus.




Hegeseth moves from table to table to ask questions of those in attendance. There were

MCRMC President Tom Adams, pictured previously with Tom Schroeder, was at Pete's during the Fox News broadcast. He offered his observations by email to your newsletter editor:

"An enthusiastic crowd met Pete Hegseth from Fox News show Fox & Friends Wednesday morning March 3 at Pete's Family Restaurant in Carthage. Good Republicans started arriving by 5am with the restaurant full to overflowing by 7am (Covid compliant, of course). Fox sent a three-person crew along with Hegseth, a producer, camera person and sound tech. The restaurant had a party atmosphere as Hegseth moved from table to table bantering with guests. Lots of the conversation revolved around the guest's knowledge of the Constitution, particularly Amendments 1, 2 and 10. There are two things we have to focus on for next year's candidates. One is to stop this cancel culture.

If necessary, create an alternative economy. If the left doesn't allow on certain platforms, then we have to create our own platforms.

The second we have to fix the election process. We need to fix each state's election rolls. Every county election board has to identify those names on the voter rolls who are no longer eligible to vote because they have moved or who have passed away.

We gave to get a government issued ID as a requirement to vote. Yes, North Carolina passed a law requiring a voter ID, but the left has been able to push the pause button by using court challenges to stop the law from going into effect. A judge has overruled that challenge, but you know the left won't stop. They claim that requiring a voter ID to vote is racist. They claim it's too difficult for blacks to get a voter ID. We all know that is a lie. In fact their very protest against the voter ID for blacks because it's too difficult to get is a racist statement in itself racist. This abuse of absentee voting has to stop. Even with laws in place, there will be people who still USE absentee ballot voting because it's easier than voting in person. Another issue with absentee voting is who is allowed to handle a completed mail in ballot. The current NC State law is very clear in this. Either the voter or a close relative are the only persons able to mail an absentee ballot. This law must remain on the books unchanged.

Poll observers both during the voting process and the tabulation of the ballets, must have access to the process and can verify the voting process is following state law and the votes are tabulated completely and accurately.


